

## Health Intervention in April\_ SSSD

### Homs

During the month of April, reproductive health services in partnership with UNFPA were provided to 6 villages within the Talkalakh area, Homs Governorate, which included:

1. Health education lectures on obstetrics and gynecology
2. Practical activities such as exercise to prevent gynecological diseases like prolapse and urinary incontinence.
3. Medical examination for pregnant women (antenatal care)- nursing care- providing family planning services (family planning consultation- providing hormonal contraceptives such as combined and simple pills- barrier contraceptives)
4. Medical examination for gynecological diseases with the provision of drug treatment and early detection of tumors.
5. Providing personal hygiene services during menstruation for adolescent girls through various activities

The numbers of beneficiaries were as follows:

- 170 beneficiaries (medical examination, lectures and activities)
- 30 pregnant beneficiaries
- 118 girls



The Health Point team, in partnership with UNHCR, conducted awareness sessions about hepatitis, its symptoms, types, methods of transmission, and how to prevent it, in which children and women were targeted in the Al-Nahriya area in the countryside of Al-Qusayr.

Furthermore, about 45 patients were served at the health point clinic

### **Tartous**

On the occasion of World Health Day, the Health Point team in Banyas, in partnership with UNHCR, implemented two awareness sessions for women and men for 35 beneficiaries. They talked about health in its general concept, how to take care of health, and the importance of mental health in preventing many diseases, in addition to talking about hepatitis. Blood pressure and glucose monitoring sessions (22) were carried out for people who are unable to reach the center and the health point.



## **Idleb**

The health point in Sinjar, in partnership with UNHCR, conducted 2 capacity-building sessions for the community health team, and the number of beneficiaries from the session reached /27/ beneficiaries. The HP carried out 3 health surveys, and the number of beneficiaries from the surveys reached / 71 /. Furthermore, the HP continued to provide family and individual health consultations, whereby the number of beneficiaries reached / 13 / beneficiaries. As for health awareness, the latter reached /70/ beneficiaries. The number of beneficiaries of the consultations reached /105/ beneficiaries.



## **Areeshah**

In the Areeshah HP, in partnership with UNHCR, 2 FGDs were conducted, whereby there was a discussion about the most important health and environmental risks in Al-Arisha camp and their causes, the most important of which was their fear of leishmaniasis, methods of transmission, symptoms, places of spread, and methods of prevention. It was suggested to conduct awareness sessions about leishmaniasis, since there are no available means of treatment.

As for awareness sessions, topics included measles, with 200 beneficiaries reached.

## **Aleppo**

SSSD conducted its health services at the 2 health points in Aleppo, in partnership with UNHCR, as follows:
